

Spill Control Plan for Transportation Permit

1. Spill control and safety equipment carried on each vehicle
 - a. Reflectors and/or flares
 - b. Fire extinguisher
 - c. First aid kit
 - d. Rake, broom or shovel
 - e. Heavy duty gloves
 - f. Heavy duty trash bags
 - g. Safety orange vest
 - h. Flashing beacon light on vehicle
2. All loads will be enclosed, covered or tarped to prevent accidental discharge of the material during transportation. Liquid loads will be transported in water-tight vessels.
3. If a small amount of material escapes from the vehicle, the driver will stop and clean up all of the material before continuing.
4. If there is an accident or other emergency which causes a large portion of the load to be emptied and the driver cannot clean it up, the following people will be called:

Maintenance Supervisor - 302-33-56000 or 302-363-4532 (cell)
5. The contacted person will send out an additional crew and equipment to completely clean up the site. If an additional crew is not available, the person contacted will contract for clean-up services with another company.
6. If the accident or spill has the potential to cause environmental damage (either due to the nature of the waste, location of the accident or additional factors such as leaking gasoline, oil or hydraulic fluid) the person contacted will notify the DE Emergency Response Team at 302-739-9401 or the National Response Center at 1-800 662-8802.
7. This plan will be carried in all vehicles along with the transportation permit.
